

Patient Support IPD and OPD Services at Pediatric Palliative Care Services at Subhita

S. No	Services	Description
1	Ambulatory Care	It's a medical care provided on an outpatient basis outside of hospitals to promote best practice for the safe and consistent administration of intravenous antibiotics and G-CSF by Nurses trained in Palliative Care.
2	Wound management & Dressing	To prevent further contamination and convert contaminated and infected wounds into clean wounds for healing wound management is provided by trained Nurses.
3	Pain and Symptom Management	Management of pain, nausea, constipation, seizures, mucositis, constipation, diarrhea, bedsores, breathlessness, sleeplessness or any other symptoms a patient may have. This also assists with decision-making about care and treatment choices in coordination with the treating Oncologists so that the treatment is well coordinated. This is provided by trained Pediatric Palliative Care Physicians.
4	Physiotherapy	For rehabilitation and management of patients with cancer and palliative care needs which helps in improving Neuro- Muscular functions of the patients undergoing cancer treatment by trained, qualified & dedicated Physiotherapist.
5	Psychological Support	Assessment, diagnosis and treatment of the psychological problems and behavioral dysfunctions of the children and their family members resulting from cancer through Psychological counseling and other tailored psychological interventions like Expressive and Group Therapies, Child Life Interventions and Wish granting by trained Psychologist.
6	Nutritional Support	Help to assess & provide the Nutrition level of the children with Cancer through height, weight and BMI. This service is provided by Dietitian through Nutrition counseling and Supplements.
7	Terminal and End of Life Care	Age specific symptom assessment and intervention, effective communication, guidance and shared decision-making to minimize symptom burden, ease suffering, effectively manage pain, and other physical, emotional, psychosocial and spiritual issues. This also include by providing financial support for ambulance and funeral Expenses and bereavement care and counseling.
8	Parent Education Sessions	These regular ongoing sessions help the Caregivers to take care of the child during treatment at home and in the hospital setting. The Sessions are conducted by Palliative Care Physician, Nurses, Physiotherapists, Psychologists, Dietitians and Nurse Aides every Friday.
9	Medical Support	Social Workers and Medical Team provides Drugs, Diagnostics and surgeries and also facilitate support through different government schemes for children with Cancer.

10	Educational Assistance	Providing Non Formal Education to Patients and Caregivers in the IPD and OPD by trained Tutors.
11	Spiritual Support	Addressing the spiritual needs of the patients and their caregivers through daily prayers and meditation sessions.
12	Kitchen Cafeteria Services	All In patients, out patients and their caregivers are provided with free and nutritious breakfast, lunch and Dinner at PPCC Kitchen Cafeteria. The menu of the cafeteria is prepared under the guidance of the Dietitians and cooked by a dedicated team of Cooks.
